

Message for parents/carers:



This year, the school age immunisations service has introduced an online consent form. You'll be able to use this to give permission for your child to receive the nasal flu vaccination in school. The form can be accessed at www.leicsandrutlandimms.co.uk. When information is sent out from school about the nasal flu programme, it will include a unique school code which you will need to input, alongside your contact email address.

The online form will make the process easy and efficient, and will avoid letters being lost in transit. The form meets all of the NHS security standards for patient information.

Please be aware when you complete the form, that you need to input the school code **without any spaces or additional punctuation**. If you're having problems submitting the form, it's also a good idea to double check that when you confirm your email address, it matches the one originally submitted. Seasonal Flu

The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu.

Diphtheria, Tetanus & Polio (Td/IPV), Meningococcal ACWY

The Td/IPV is given as a single jab containing vaccines against diphtheria, tetanus and polio. MenACWY vaccine is also given as a single jab containing vaccines against meningitis A, C, W and Y.

Human Papilloma Virus (HPV)

Protects against cervical cancer, some mouth and throat cancers and some cancers of the anus and genital areas – for children under 15, two injections given 6-12 months apart.

Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR)

MMR is a safe and effective combined vaccine that protects against 3 separate illnesses – measles, mumps and rubella (German measles) – in a single injection. The full course of MMR vaccination requires 2 doses.
