Read the Tricky words with your child and practice spelling them. They need to know how to spell these words by the end of the year.




Top tips for reading at home with your child



Options for tasks at home:


Go on a mini-beast hunt and draw pictures of what you find.


Can you find some information on your favourite animals and create a poster.
