WHOLE SCHOOL PANTOMIME TRIP – 16th December 2026

We are delighted to announce that we have secured tickets for every child to see 'Dick Whittington' – a pantomime at Loughborough Town Hall, on Wednesday 16th December 2026.

The coaches will leave Danemill at around 9.00 am and will depart from Loughborough at 1pm. These times are all approximate and, of course, depend wholly on the traffic and weather conditions on the day of the pantomime.

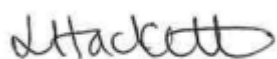
The children will have school lunches as normal, however, on the day of the trip the lunchbreak will be later than normal. Because of this, please provide your child/children with a snack and a drink (no fizzy drinks) to take with them to the theatre. There will be no hot meals served on this day; instead, children will be able to order a school packed lunch, or bring their own. Children will need to wear school uniform, suitable footwear and coats for the winter weather.

The total cost per child will be £16.70. The school has no funds to subsidise this visit and it can only take place provided that all parents/carers are prepared to make this voluntary contribution to cover the costs, as permitted by the Education Act 1996. If we receive insufficient voluntary contributions it may be necessary to review whether the activity goes ahead or not. If you are in receipt of Pupil Premium the cost has already been altered for you on Arbor, if you have any issues please contact the school office.

Please can you give your consent and pay for this trip on the school online payment system, Arbor. The last date for payment is Sunday 15th November 2026, **you will not be able to book after this date due to us having to book tickets and transport**. If you require login details, or any information regarding the payment process, please contact the school office.

We believe that this outing will be a valuable and enjoyable experience for all participating students. It provides an opportunity for them to engage with a classic tale and immerse themselves in the magic of live theatre.
